Regional Level

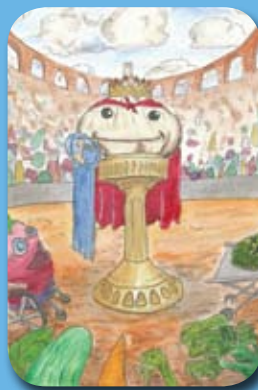
Two stories from each grade level will be chosen for regional recognition and awarded:

State Level

One story from each grade level will be chosen as the state winner and awarded:

- Medal
- \$100 savings bond
- \$100 worth of resources for their teacher
- Expense-paid trip to Sacramento for student, teacher and two parents/guardians for an awards ceremony during National Agriculture Week

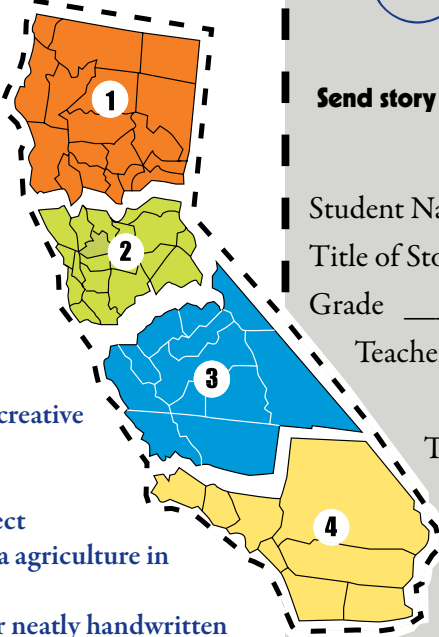

Entry details...

- Submit the top five stories from your class
- Each story must have an entry form attached
- Individual grade categories: grades 3-8
- Each story must be individually written by student authors
- Stories should not be similar in theme to winning entries from previous years' contests

Winning Stories must be:

- Titled and original, creative student work
- Fact or fiction
- Grammatically correct
- Related to California agriculture in a positive way
- Typed, preferably, or neatly handwritten
- Written without reference to registered trademarks
- Stories exceeding 750 words will not be selected as state winners
- Suitable for illustration
